#### **Climbing to the Top of Blooms**

Facilitators: Libby Serkies and Kimberlie Hall

**Description:** Bloom's Revised Taxonomy is a tool used to categorize the behaviors students can/will exhibit as they learn. The model for the taxonomy is a triangle whose base is made up of the lower order thinking skills of remembering, understanding, and applying. These levels are critically important as students build conceptual knowledge (especially in a new or foundational course) in their program of study. Many instructors feel they are not able to access the top levels of Bloom's (the higher order thinking skills) which include analyzing, evaluating, and creating because there isn't enough time, the students aren't ready for that amount of self-regulated learning, or any number of other reasons. This session will take a deep dive into Bloom's and demonstrate how no matter where a course is in a program or the academic calendar, we can expect to get our students to the top.
